## **Residency Standards for Out of State Residents**

### ***Non-Resident Information***

A student who resides in a state other than Texas, is considered a non-resident.

Residency rates are calculated based on the information below:

- 1. Students residing in Oklahoma, Arkansas, New Mexico and Louisiana will receive the Border County waiver.**  
Senate Bill 1272 allows students residing in Oklahoma, Arkansas, New Mexico and Louisiana to receive the in-state tuition rate. A tuition waiver will be applied to the students account once the student has registered and the student's bill has been calculated and therefore will receive the in-state tuition rate. (Border County)
- 2. Students residing in the other 44 contiguous states will receive the Border State waiver.**  
A non-resident student who resides in the other 44 contiguous states will pay the in-state tuition rate plus \$30.00 per credit per hour. (Border State)
- 3. International Students and Students from Alaska and Hawaii**  
Students who are international or reside in Alaska and Hawaii will be charged our full out-of-state tuition rate.

If you reside in Texas and have been classified as an out-of-resident, please check your admissions checklist to see what information is needed to update you to a Texas resident.

## Residence Hall Rates per person/per semester

- Traditional Studio Style room: Studio- Approx. 352 sq. ft.; \$2483 per semester
- 2 Bedroom, 1 bath: Two Bed Room - Approx. 444 sq. ft.; \$3241 per semester
- 4 Bedroom, 2 bath: Four Bed Room - Approx. 900 sq. ft.; \$3132 per semester

## Meal Plans per person per/per semester

- The Golden Eagle: Unlimited meals per week; \$250 declining dollars: \$2277.59 per semester
- The Bald Eagle: 14 meals per week; \$250 declining dollars: \$2077.27 per semester
- The Nesting Eagle:(Junior and Seniors only) 10 meals per week; \$100 declining dollars: \$1741.69\*\*

## Financial Aid:

**Grants** - money which does not have to be repaid. It is awarded to students who demonstrate a financial need upon the completion of the FAFSA as a means of partially meeting their demonstrated financial need.

**Scholarships** – Students are encouraged to look into inside and outside scholarships. Do not forget about your employer, credit union or bank, or local non-profit when looking for scholarships!

**Loans** – this includes both federal loans available through the FAFSA and private loans. Loans assist in paying college by loaning you a certain dollar amount. Loans are to be paid back to your lender.
